## Regional Ultrasound for Obstetric Anesthesia Workshop

Upon completion of this session, participants will be able to understand the physics behind and image interpretation of ultrasound, learn techniques for identification of vascular structures and the lumbar spine, and incorporate techniques to facilitate placement of intravascular catheters as well as epidural, spinal, CSE, ilioinguinal, iliohypogastric, and trans-versus abdominis plane blocks through hands-on demonstrations.

Upon completion of this presentation, participants will be able to evaluate and minimize the impact of co-morbid conditions on the pregnant patient, and discuss ways to alter anesthetic management for optimal outcomes.

## Anesthetic Management of Obstetric Issues

Upon completion of this presentation, participants will be able to discuss how anesthetic management can affect maternal and fetal outcomes associated with common obstetric issues.

## Post-Delivery Obstetric Hemorrhage

Upon completion of this presentation, participants will be able to explain the strategies employed by anesthetic, obstetric and transfusion medicine specialists in response to post-partum obstetric hemorrhage.

## Post-Delivery Pain Management

Upon completion of this presentation, participants will be able to indicate how to predict analgesic requirements prior to surgery and minimize post-delivery acute and chronic pain.

## Underutilized Options?

Upon completion of this presentation, participants will be able to indicate whether less commonly used management options for labor and post-operative analgesia, team training and hemodynamic monitoring have value in contemporary practice. In addition, participants will be able to appraise the recent scientific literature regarding anesthetic care of the parturient and develop strategies for the management of epidural and spinal failures.

## Anesthetic Considerations for the Morbidly Obese Parturient

Upon completion of this presentation, participants will be able to identify the issues involved in the airway and anesthetic management in the morbidly obese parturient. In addition, the participant will be able to evaluate ways to minimize postoperative ventilation complications in all pregnant patients.

## Maternal and Neonatal Resuscitation

Upon completion of this presentation, participants will be able to discuss current management strategies for the resuscitation of the mother and neonate.

## Optimizing Airway and Anesthetic Techniques

Upon completion of this presentation, participants will be able to discuss the response to an unexpected obstetric difficult airway or a high spinal. In addition, participants will be able to determine whether combined spinal epidural techniques should be used more frequently for obstetric care.

## Complications

Upon completion of this presentation, participants will be able to discuss major complications associated with the provision of obstetric anesthesia and indicate strategies to avoid medicolegal issues.
