DESCRIPTION

The purpose of this workshop is to provide the obstetric anesthesiologist with the necessary skills to successfully use ultrasound for guidance. The course will discuss and demonstrate the use

of ultrasound as an aid to evaluate cardiac function and intravascular volume status, to evaluate for presence of pneumothorax and pulmonary edema, to aid in neuraxial anesthesia and TAP (transverse abdominis plane) blocks for the parturient and also for basic fetal ultrasound (including evaluation of fetal heart rate and biophysical profile). Instruction includes both didactic and hands-on sessions. Each student will have the opportunity to use ultrasound equipment for scanning live models.

OBJECTIVES:

- Upon completion of this workshop, the participant will be able to:
1. Use ultrasound in order to aide in the clinical assessment of normal and depressed cardiac function
 2. Use ultrasound in order to aide in clinical assessment of pulmonary edema and pneumothorax

 4. Use ultrasound in order to facilitate neuraxial anesthesia techniques and also to facilitate performing an ultrasound guided transverse abdominis plane (TAP) block for the parturient

Failed Epidural Catheter on the Labor Suite: How to Make Your Catheters Work/Accidental Dural Puncture

DESCRIPTION

This workshop will examine the reason that epidural catheters that worked for labor now fail to provide adequate surgical anesthesia for cesarean delivery. The incidence of failed epidural is reported to be approximately 10%. The most likely reason is failure to identify it during management of labor. There are several maneuvers that may be done to decrease the incidence of failed epidural. When examining the epidural catheter that failed to provide adequate anesthesia, the number of boluses the patient received during labor and the number of times the anesthesia provider was required to evaluate the patient should be examined. Once the failed epidural is identified, the practitioner is confronted with the decision of whether to proceed with general or spinal anesthesia or repeat the epidural catheter. The third leading cause of a malpractice claim against an anesthesia provider is for a headache. The most common reason for a headache related to anesthesia is accidental dural puncture. A recent survey of members of the Society for Obstetric Anesthesia and Perinatology revealed that of the respondents, very few had a written protocol for the management of an accidental dural puncture. There are several maneuvers that have been proposed to decrease

the risk of headache and of how to manage if a headache develops. This workshop will explore both occurrences and discuss means for managing. If you are interested in earning points toward Part 4: Improvement in Practice for Maintenance of Certification in Anesthesiology, a survey examining practice six months after the workshop must be completed.
