2. Utilize the latest evidence on patient outcomes and novel regional anesthesia techniques to optimize the perioperative pain management after cesarean delivery

Panel - The Role of Truncal Blocks to Optimize Cesarean Delivery Analgesia

A multi-modal approach to treat pain and reduce opioid use following cesarean delivery is important. The session will describe and outline truncal blocks that could be utilized to provide analgesia in the cesarean setting. Fred Hehre Lecture: Dogmas in Obstetric Anesthesia: The Balance Between Evidence, Common Sense, Habit and Fear

Some practices in Obstetric Anesthesia lack sufficient evidence to support them. They are based on a mix of insufficient evidence (or lack thereof), common sense, habit and fear. Some of them, while meant to preserve patient safety, may unnecessarily prevent ideal patient care. The identification of such practices and a pragmatic discussion of their roots and assessment of their risk/benefit may offer opportunities to revisit them and eventually promote changes that may benefit patients.

Gerard W. Ostheimer Lecture - What's New in Obstetric Anesthesia?

Always a highlight of the meeting, the Gerard W. Ostheimer lecture is a review of important, relevant, and/or practice-changing literature related to obstetric anesthesia, obstetrics, perinatology, and allied medical disciplines that was published in calendar year 2018. This year's Ostheimer lecturer will be Dr. Carolyn Weiniger. This presentation will bring you up to date on the latest evidence-based advances in the anesthetic management of pregnant women.

Gertie Marx Research Competition

In memory of Gertie Marx, this session is a presentation of obstetric anesthesia research judged by peers as the best quality research done by medical students, residents, and fellows. This is a judged competition, moderated by Dr. Philip Hess.

Interdisciplinary Panel - Cardiac Disease

In the care of pregnant women with cardiac disease, the importance of seamless multidisciplinary management cannot be overemphasized. This highly interactive and entertaining panel of experts in cardiac disease in pregnancy will share the perspectives of the cardiologist, the maternal fetal medicine specialist and the cardiovascular and obstetric anesthesiologist as we work through the challenges of caring for pregnant women with cardiac disease.

It's All in Her Head: Approaches to the Anesthetic Management of Pregnant Women with Intracranial Disease

This multidisciplinary panel will utilize a case-based approach to discuss intracranial disease in the parturient. Panelists will discuss how the physiologic changes of intracranial disease interact with pregnancy with specific considerations for anesthetic planning for both obstetric and neurologic care.

Oral Presentations

Oral presentations of high quality peer-reviewed scientific research related to obstetric anesthesia will be presented, followed by a question and answer session.

Research Hour - Defining, Evaluating and Influencing Recovery After Cesarean Delivery

There has been increased interest in qualitative and quantitative measurements of recovery following surgery. The panel will discuss key metrics and available recovery scores that can be used to evaluate and track recovery after cesarean delivery. A recently developed obstetric-specific recovery tool, the ObsQoR-10, will be presented. Maternal and neonatal factors that can improve recovery after cesarean delivery will also be outlined in this session.

Society for Maternal-Fetal Medicine (SMFM) - What's New in Obstetrics?

Maternal mortality is on the rise, and sepsis remains a major contributor. The pregnant patient poses many challenges that can be managed with a better understanding of the physiologic changes seen in both the mother and the fetomaternal interface. We will discuss how pregnancy impacts the diagnosis and management of sepsis and a step-wise approach to treating the dyad of mother and fetus. We will also focus on potential issues and complications that can present with this particular population.

Special Lecture: Patient Perspectives

This session will highlight patient perspectives on the labor and delivery experience. A highlight will be the participation of Stephanie Arnold, the author of "37 Seconds", her personal account of a near fatal amniotic fluid embolus. The impact of intrapartum and childhood trauma on the birth experience and beyond will be addressed with guidance on strategies for optimal care.

What's New in Neonatology?

Dr. Alan Bedrick, professor and division chief of neonatology at the Department of Pediatrics at the University of Arizona College of Medicine – Tucson, will present an update on recent developments in neonatal medicine.

Why Should You Care About Maternal Levels of Care?

This session will focus on two important initiatives aimed at improving obstetrical care in the US: the designation of ACOG levels of maternal care and of SOAP Centers of Excellence for Anesthesia Care of Obstetric Patients. Both efforts will be described in detail, with particular focus on elements of relevance to practicing obstetric anesthesiologists.

Drug Shortages: What Can I Do For My Patients?

This drug shortage overview will address recent increases in shortages and potential alternative dosing strategies for obstetric patients. In addition, AHSP guidelines for mitigating impact of drug shortages and partnering with pharmacy will be reviewed.

Management of Neuraxial Labor Analgesia

This lecture will describe useful updates for management of neuraxial labor analgesia including various procedural techniques, maintenance of analgesia with infusion pumps, and options for labor analgesia after accidental dural puncture occurs.

My Two Cents - Controversial Topics

Robust differences exist in clinical analgesia management! Does a dural puncture (i.e., CSE or dural puncture epidural) add worthy value or unjustified risk to a labor epidural technique? Similarly, in a fully dilated parturient in pain, what should be given through the existing epidural catheter? Nothing? Local Anesthetic? Opioid? What's the evidence?

Obstetric Hemorrhage

This lecture will summarize current clinical approaches to the prevention and management of postpartum hemorrhage.

Post Dural Puncture Headache

A review of post dural puncture headache risk factors, pathophysiology, and treatment as relates to the obstetric patient in a refresher course lecture format.

Substance Use Disorder

This lecture summarizes evolving knowledge regarding adverse maternal, fetal, and neonatal effects of opioid exposure during pregnancy, and current treatment options for opioid use disorder (OUD). Despite increased knowledge of post-partum hemorrhage, the incidence is rising. The risk of severe PPH increases as the fibrinogen concentration decreases. Early recognition of hemorrhage through quantification of blood loss and laboratory testing can facilitate early therapeutic intervention to minimize maternal morbidity. Administration of uteronic agents and other pharmacologic adjuncts, in addition to adherence to a protocol-based approach to managing hemorrhage, can decrease blood product utilization and improve outcomes.
